Paraphasic errors similar to spoken language have been observed; whereas in spoken language a phonemic substitution would occur (e.g. “tagle” instead of “table”), in ASL case studies errors in movement, hand position, and morphology have been noted.

Information

Larsen has its roots in Royal Gothic by P.M. Shanks (known as London Gothic in the U.S.), but also takes cues from the somewhat related German typeface Zeitungs-Grotesque, both of which made their first appearance in the 1870s.

Strict reviving is discarded with more even stroke widths in addition to taking other liberties with design, for example the clunky, out-of-place S/s. While toning down certain aspects of the original Royal Gothic, other distinctive details are amplified, such as the low radius round-to-straight shapes of B, D, P and R. All this while avoiding overly clean and modular appearance. The original normal width is expanded to a range of four widths while keeping the overall density coherent.
